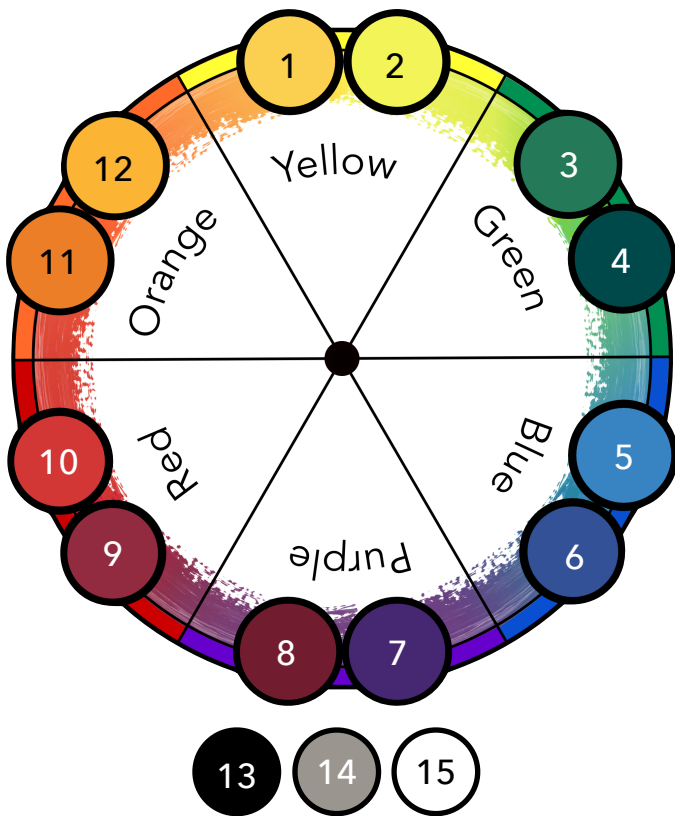


Intense Modern Palette

These colors are characterized by their greater transparency and their capacity to produce intense tints and mixtures.

Tinting, Toning, and Shading Colors



Color Tint Tone Shade

Color Color from the tube
Tint Color + White
Tone Color + Portland Grey
Shade Color + Chromatic Black

Adjusting Value & Reducing Intensity



Portland Grey Dark, Medium, and Light mapped to the Munsell value scale.

Using neutral gray allows you to do two things: 1) Adjust the Value (how light or dark a color is), 2) Lower the Intensity of a color without making the color muddy. [Link to more information.](#)
